8. Describe pharmacokinetic and pharmacodynamic considerations in different patient populations receiving anticoagulants.
9. Review evidence based practices for managing diverse patient populations who require anticoagulation.

1. Describe the potential advantages for patients with dabigatran compared to warfarin.
 2. Describe the advantages of the new injectable anticoagulant agents compared to unfractionated heparin.
 3. List examples of "special populations" with regard to anticoagulant dosing.
